5.2	Burnley chosen for Mohiuddin International Girls College (MIGC) because right building became available at right time.	
5.3	Idea is to bring another high quality educational establishment to this area.	
5.4	The College is for all the community of any background – research suggests that men and women perform better when educated separately.	
5.5	Could be a challenge for Muslim community – idea is to empower influential women to come back and influence the community in a positive way and create leaders.	
5.6	There will be no dress code and community engagement will be mandatory for all students. Initial talks have taken place with Barnardos and Help the Aged.	
5.7	Education will be at least Ofsted standard although will not be Ofsted inspected because privately owned.	
5.8	In 2010 most students will be European. 2011 will see students from elsewhere. Visa applications take time to complete. Furthest application has come from South Africa – no applications from Burnley, Pendle or Rossendale as yet.

5.10	Trust has other educational establishments outside of the UK. Chair of Trust is UK trained. 1500 full time students (500 of which will be residential). Residential students will not be permitted to park cars though cannot stop students bringing cars to Burnley. Local residents been contacted and have offered to organise an afternoon tea. Fees for day students have not yet been set.

5.12	Advertisements for staff have appeared in the Times, Guardian and local press. Members raised issue of problem recruiting good quality staff for schools already in existence. MIGC is aware of problem and will be building staff slowly and not employing all at once.
