1.	Welcome and Introductions	CT
	CT welcomed everyone to the meeting. Introductions were made and apologies noted. Item 3 to be deferred to item 4	
2.	Minutes and Matters arising from last meeting	CT
	SB mentioned that probation had not represented over the last two meetings. Negotiations are in the early stages to use probation in the community payback scheme. Preston has now signed onto to use the scheme but the group acknowledged that they wouldn't know the extent it had been used across the borough.	
3.	Partnership Performance Update and Summer Confidence	JB
	<p>JB informed the group that this was still a working document and still needed work on the analytical data to work within the current priorities for the CSP Partnership.</p> <p>Action: Lauren to circulate to the group as soon as it is available.</p> <p>SM will support RA and JB in this project. The group agreed that if the information was rich in content it would encourage support across the partnership. A discussion took place as to the full benefit this information is to the group.</p> <p>JB informed the group that there had been 264 less reports in ASB making an 8.3% reduction.</p> <p>SM informed the group of the minimum standards launch which had taken place today. Karen Ainsworth informed the group of a good model for ASB victims that Calico use.</p> <p>LH to liaise with KA.</p> <p>The group discussed domestic violence there had been 3% increase in reports the group agreed that this was positive more people reporting, due to more confidence in services. We have the highest detective rates in the area.</p> <p>SAC April, May and June 105 less reports making a 26.9% reduction All crime 12% down Criminal Damage 17.9% reduction</p> <p>Jon informed the group that there would be an increase in no of offenders coming back into the area over the next few weeks. Paula Duxbury would be circulating the relevant information to partners</p> <p>The group agreed that the reductions over the last year had been good. What the group needed to do would be to predict trends over the next 12 months. This would be achievable with the new proposed document, the group acknowledged that this would need to be done in plenty of time for the meeting and then it could be brought to the table as a</p>	

	<p>discussion.</p> <p>A discussion took place around the role of the press and the group agreed that we needed to be more pro active in communicating positive achievements. Claire Pearson and Clare Edens pointed out that the Communications Group was successful in achieving this. The Burnley Express had been very supportive and was widely read. The group acknowledged that the Lancashire Telegraph looked for more sensational stories. JS said that we would be in a stronger position this year and we needed to have drip drip approach with the press. Sheila Battersby suggested that using this meeting was a good way of getting the message across.</p> <p><u>Summer Confidence 12th July -20 August</u></p> <p>JB explained the summer confidence due to take place between the 12th July and 20th August. 6 strands had been identified;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Access and Visibility Lancs Criminal Justice Week ASB Week Vulnerable People Quality of Life Road Safety <p>Claire Pearson and Clare Edens had completed action plans for all 6 strands.</p>	
4.	Reducing Reoffending IOM update and discussion regarding Restorative Justice in Burnley	JH
	<p>JH gave a brief update and informed the group that the funding was lost from the Home Office as of March next year. The last few months have been spent looking for alternative funding streams, lottery funding is a possibility. A discussion took place into the Lancashire Wide Revolution. Burnley is the pilot area and a mapping exercise has been completed by Shona Drummond. The results are positive, the accommodation pathway is strong in the area and this provides greater potential for offenders to be housed on release. Street sex workers and vulnerable females are also receiving intensive help.</p> <p><u>Restorative Justice</u></p> <p>Trying to link this with the confidence agenda to communicate the positive messages across to the public. There have been a number of very recent successful interventions. JH suggested that we are not using restorative justice as much as we could. Probation are looking at making restorative justice part of a persons probation order.</p>	
5.	Safer Lancashire Board Update	CT
	<p>CT updated the group on the Safer Lancashire Board Update restructure has now gone to vote 'not to proceed with rationalisation as</p>	

	<p>proposed' In light of this the board will continue as is. The group agreed that it wasn't the correct time to make changes as we are in a period of change with the coalition government.</p> <p><u>Lancs Safer Alcohol Network</u></p> <p>A discussion took place highlighting the duplication of services. A meeting has been arranged to simplify the existing structure. KA said that this was a useful forum and it would be detrimental if legislation was passed to say that these partnerships were no longer necessary. There is a threat that this work could be undone. CT asked if Sheila Battersby could feed this information back.</p>

7.	Safe and Confident Neighbourhoods Strategy	SM
	<p>This was to link to the minimum standards, SM asked if the group could look at the document and SM and JB would report back at the next meeting.</p> <p>Action: LH to put on as an agenda item at the next meeting</p>	
8.	NIPS and Area Teams	MW
	<p>Mike Wellock gave the group a presentation from Neighbourhood management on the new NIPS Neighbourhood Investment Plan. The plans have been put together for 3 areas of Burnley to strengthen partnership working. The document sets out what we as a council can deliver to neighbourhoods. Mike asked the group for feedback, one of the issues raised was in collating this information some agencies are duplicating work. Helen James will shortly be distributing the 6 objectives and measures. JB said that it needed to be more of an overlay of information from partners. MW explained to the group that this is a huge piece of work to collate. He is due to come over to MAPS and Community Safety to discuss. SM asked MW if he and JB could be included in any action plan.</p> <p>An issue was raised around absentee landlords and the problems associated with this in Burnley. SM explained that work was being done in this area, Sheila highlighted that the possible change in policy may impact on Burnley.</p> <p>The group agreed that MW be invited to attend the next Steering group and update the partners.</p> <p>Action: LH to send minutes to MW Action: LH to liaise with MW re distribution NIPS</p>	

9.	MAPS Comms and Beatsweep	CP
	<p>CP informed the group that she would be sitting on the Lancs Comms Group.</p> <p><u>World Cup</u></p> <p>CP updated the group on the World Cup Campaign and distributed the Burnley Express with the pull out section covering the campaign. The radio ad for 2BR was also played to the group. Week 1 had been DV, This week (week 2) would be alcohol, week 3 Fire Safety and week 4 Recycling. The evaluation will be completed in week 5. The cost of the campaign had been £5k in total and Pendle have jumped on the back of this.</p> <p>There is also a planned relaunch of the R&R centre in August, CP mentioned a thanks to the PCT in the funding for this.</p> <p>CP asked if any of the group would like to attend the Communications group to discuss anything to liaise with her.</p> <p><u>Beatsweep</u></p> <p>3 have been completed in total, the action plans were circulated to the group. The reviews for each are completed after 3 months, the feedback from the Briercliffe event will be available for the meeting. CP informed the group that they had received approx £3K worth of free advertising from the events in the Newspaper.</p> <p><u>Lifemaps Operation</u></p> <p>CP asked the group about the proposed new Lifemaps operation. A review had been completed on the previous Lifemaps and the feedback had been very positive. As a result of this CP will be taking over the administrative role in the project, CP asked the group for their full commitment to the project. The proposed project would be a 3 day residential for 30 young people possibly girls. Young People's Service will take the lead on the residential. There would also be a 4 week follow up. CP was hoping to hold 2 courses per year with each being specific for a certain group.</p> <p>JS informed the group that improvements had been made in the proposed delivery of the project but it needed to link directly with the strategic priorities, she acknowledged that we were in a better position than last time</p> <p>Tom Woodcock mentioned possible funding through the East Lancs Funding Group if there was drugs and alcohol link.</p> <p>CP to link with Tom Woodcock re funding</p>	

	<p>Timescale for project looking at the 20th September</p> <p>A second option would be to submit a bid with links to the strategic assessment via the CSP Commissioning Group and Thematic Lead.</p> <p>Action: SM to link with CP</p>

	<p>WNF Funding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MAPS - £50k. No MAPS Intervention budget for this year. • Community Safety - £60k (plus £14k from previous WNF underspend). Provides salaries for Police Secondment and DV services (inc. DV Co-ordinator) • Youth Bus - £74k (additional funding - £25k ASDA & £11k from Children's Services) <p>*figures are subject to change.</p> <p>Area Based Grant</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • As with 2009/10 the allocation we have received confirmation of is £95k.
